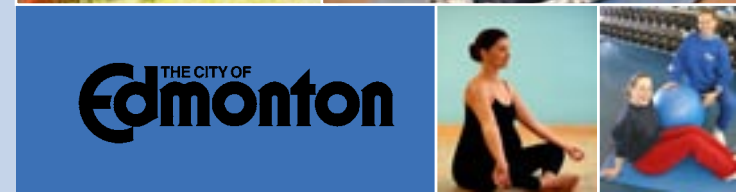
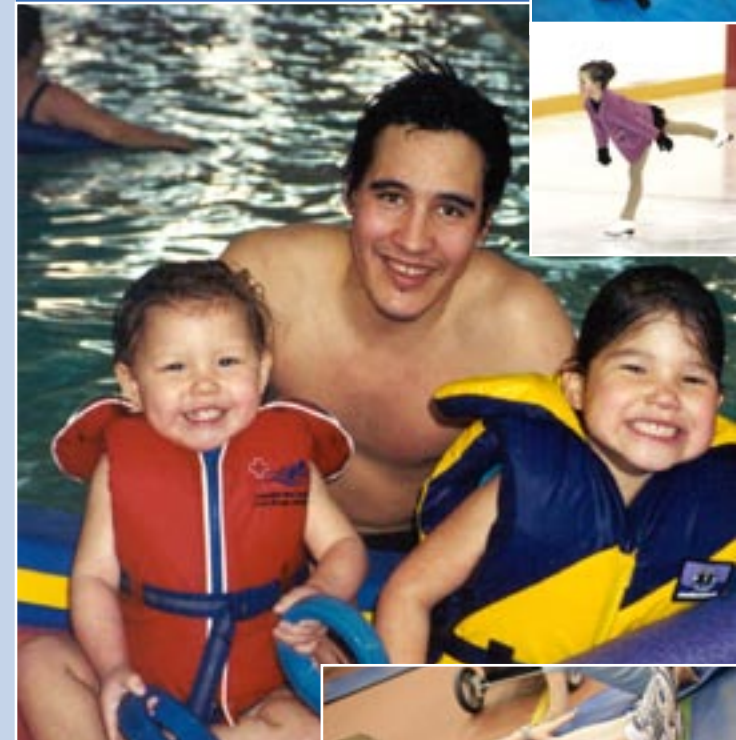

What is the Leisure Access Program?

- The Leisure Access Program gives low-income Edmontonians unlimited free admissions to City of Edmonton recreation facilities and registered programs at a lower cost. This program is offered by the City of Edmonton Community Services department.

What does the Leisure Access Program give each card holder?

- Unlimited, free admissions to City of Edmonton owned and operated recreation facilities including Leisure Centres, Fort Edmonton Park, Valley Zoo, Muttart Conservatory and Arenas.
- Three registered programs for adults and seniors at 75% off of the cost of the program.
- Four registered programs for children and youth (age 2 – 17) at 75% off of the cost of the program.
- Extra program materials (required manuals, supplies etc) at 75% off of the regular cost of the program materials.
- Access for one year (after your card expires, you will need to re-apply for the program).

Who is not eligible for the program?

- Full-time students at the University of Alberta, NAIT and Grant MacEwan College are excluded except for students with children who are living below the low-income cut-off line
- Individuals and families that live above the low-income cut-off line (specified on the program application form)

Can I get a Leisure Access Program card without filling out an application form?

You may automatically qualify for the program if you are on AISH, Income Support, have an Alberta Child Health Benefit card or Alberta Works Health Benefit card. In this case, you can get your card at a City of Edmonton facility:

- Show your valid Health Benefits Card (AISH or Income Support) and one of the following: Driver's License, Birth Certificate, or Alberta Health Care Card. You and those listed on your Health Benefits card will be issued Leisure Access Program cards right away.
- Show your VOIDED Health Benefits Card (AISH or Income Support and have Treaty Status) and the following: the Adult(s) Treaty Status card, and address verification (utility bill or Client Reporting Card). You and your immediate family will be issued Leisure Access Program cards right away.
- Show your Child Health Benefits Card or an Alberta Works Health Benefits Card and the following: the conformation letter that you received with either your Alberta Child Health Benefit card or your Alberta Works Health Benefit card, (if you need to get a letter re-sent to you call 427-6848) and some form of identification: Driver's License, Birth Certificate, or Alberta Health Care Card. You and those listed on the card (including the spouse that is NOT listed on the card will be issued Leisure Access Program cards right away.

How can I get a card if I'm not on AISH, Income Support, or don't have an Alberta Child Health Benefit card or Alberta Works Health Benefit card?

- If you are NOT on the above mentioned programs then you must apply to be a part of the program by filling out an application form.
